To Our Mothers

From My Heart to Yours
"Do not be afraid of the
enemy; take courage to
fight for your sons and
daughters, wives and

Here we are at Mothers
Day again and I know
many of you are in battles of different
sources: some loved
ones in prison, some just
out and trying to find
work and housing, some
with kids home on house
arrest, some still using,
some in rehab doing well
praise the Lord, some
with peace finally in your
situation, and some
awaiting court.

At one point in my journey I experienced all of the above.

It was sometimes hard to go to church and be acknowledged as a Mother because of how the enemy had convinced me that I didn't measure up to the standards of being a GOOD Mother. Why could I not have the joy and peace in my heart that the other

Mothers around me seemed to. I had an empty seat at our table that stared me blatantly in the face. One of my children was either on the streets using drugs, in jail or prison, or often away somewhere I had no clue.

It is with all that in mind that I covenant to pray for each of you as this Mother's Day approaches. For today I have that chair filled and our son is trying his best, with the Lord's help, to take care of his family and express his love and sorrow for the times he chose not to. My prayer is that you will experience that in your situation very soon.

I loved the passage in Nehemiah 4 that recently reminded me not to be afraid of the enemy but to remember the Lord and imprint Him on our minds while continuing to fight for our loved ones in prayer. In answer to the prayers the people offered up

God frustrated their purpose.

In the same way as we stand in the gap through prayer for our loved ones I know God will frustrate the plans of the enemy in our prodigals life. I encourage you to pray over the Prodigal Card and the Dry Bones Prayer from Ezekiel 37. Keep the faith and BELIEVE that God can overcome any obstacle we face.

Please consider coming to our Prayer Support Meeting May 5, 2014 at 6:30 as Jeanette Weygandt shares about grief. This journey takes us back and forth through the journey of grief.
