A Great Light!

In our last newsletter, I talked about a prophecy for On Wings, which was about rescuing people from darkness. It began to be my prayer from Isaiah 9:2 that those walking in darkness would see a great light.

Then as I became involved in Strip Club outreach, God took me to Ephesians 5:8, "For once you were in darkness, but now you are light—lead the lives of those native born to the Light." Verse 11 "Take no part in and have no fellowship with the fruitless deeds and enterprise of darkness but instead (let your lives be so in contrast as to) expose and reprove and convict them. For it is a shame even to speak of or mention the things that (such people) practice in secret. But when anything is exposed and reproved by the Light, it is made visible and clear and where everything is visible and clear, there is light.

We have heard so much about the darkness in the prisons. Our family learned a little about that darkness when our son was on the inside. We now receive many letters from those who share about the darkness they see on the inside.

Also, as I enter the doors of the strip club to minister to those gals, I'm hit in the face with the

darkness both in a physical and spiritual sense. The Ephesians passage comes to life as we see things being done in secret we can't talk about. It's been our prayer that we would be the light that would shine into that darkness as we enter. The last time we were at the strip club, one of the gals told us that we bring light to them and that they can sense our spirit lingering after we leave. How awesome is that? There are times when we wonder how much good our visits make, but then God gives us an encouraging word that we are making a difference. We also get letters from the prison telling us how they have come out of the darkness of Wiccan, cults and atheism. We send in the Word of God and offer Bible Studies so that they might come to Jesus, our true Light. Only His Light can overcome darkness.

> I like the passage in John 1:4-5, "In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. And the Light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not comprehend it.'

A few years ago, our board members were presented an oil lamp made by a potter. It was to be a reminder as it burned of the light of the world. When the light coming from it fills the dark room, the powers of darkness are overcome by the person and work of Jesus Christ.

We are to be His light shining out in a dark world. Everywhere we go, we are to be His Light bearers. In order to shine we must stay plugged into the source of that Light so that those we meet know we have been with the Father. If we don't stay plugged in daily to the power source, our light grows dim and eventually burns out.

As 2018 comes to a close and a new year is on the horizon, commit to recharge daily in His Word so that your light will not be hidden in a world desperate for it as they sit in darkness. Be the light of the world. Remember the little song "The Light of the World"? It says, "Hide it under a bushel? No! I'm going to let it shine."


