

There is Hope In Your Future

"I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heaven ward in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:14

I know we say it every year, but where did the year go? The word we had for On Wings in 2025 was "Press On". Many of you have come a long way from the first time we met. Many come to share their story with me with tears in their eyes and a feeling of hopelessness in their heart. Over time, you made the choice to let go of your prodigal and walk toward a path of healing for yourself, and it has been beautiful to watch. You have learned to set boundaries, stop enabling, pray scripture over your loved one, to forgive, and to laugh again.

One mother came to us almost in a fetal position. She was full of shame and hopelessness, but by the time she shared her story, realizing she was in a safe space with others walking the same journey, she was able to sit up a little straighter. I have witnessed it many times since that moment with several of our ladies. You can come out of hopelessness to the realization that there is hope for your future.

We are finishing the year with a strong study with Lori Hauswirth, learning Biblical tools for living courageously. On Wings will continue to offer studies to help you grow in your spiritual journey with our Lord, encouraging you to find the peace that only comes from Him in especially difficult situations. FIXING MY GAZE

This time of year fills our senses with an abundance of lights, a steady flow of sounds, and new and enticing aromas. It becomes so easy to become distracted

and overwhelmed as my senses become overstimulated and pulled in many directions.

I think back on our Savior's birth. Mary quietly holding Jesus and gazing into His face, Joseph standing nearby observing and watching. The shepherds coming to Jesus, amazed and looking at Him. Simeon, who watched and waited for years, was finally able to say, "My eyes have seen Your salvation." The first Christmas was not one of glitz and glimmer, but one of awe, excitement, and gazing at the Savior.

Hebrews 12:2 instructs us to "fix our eyes on Jesus." The Greek word for fixing our eyes is aphorao, which means "to turn the eyes away from other things and fix on something". We have several examples of the disciples telling people to "look at us" and looking directly and intently at someone. Stop paying attention to the distractions, the things that pull you away, and be intentional about looking at what matters.

Lights, sounds, and activities aren't the only things pulling at us this Christmas. It's often a season of anxiety, of sadness, and sometimes isolation. The "To Do" list can be overwhelming, the decorations can be daunting, and the baking a little shy of the photo Betty Crocker is displaying. There is plenty of sadness and disappointment over who might not be joining the festive meal, over words spoken out of exhaustion or anger, and over unmet expectations of ourselves and others.


When Christmas seems to be just a little too formidable: stop, breathe, and "fix our eyes on Jesus". Let Him remind us of Whom we celebrate, the joy He gives, and His peace in the midst of chaos. When anxiety and disappointments abound, aphorao - turn the eyes away from other things and fix on something (or Someone).

As I gaze intently on Jesus this Christmas, being grateful for His birth and His salvation, I plan to let the lights and sounds be a constant reminder to keep my eyes fixed on Him. Hebrews 12:2 goes on to read "Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith." Gaze at Him and let Jesus perfect us. That is one beautiful Christmas gift!

Did you ever buy something and afterward realize you already had it? I've done that a few times. I've actually ordered something, only to discover later that I already had it but forgot.
